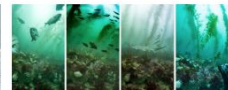

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Senators Urge Trump to Fund National Sea Grant College Program

Washington—Before the Trump administration is expected to unveil its Fiscal Year 2019 budget proposal, Senator Dianne Feinstein (D-Calif.) joined with 22 senators to call on President Trump to not cut funding for the National Sea Grant College Program. In a letter to the president, the senators highlighted the important role the program play in boosting local economies and preserving coastal communities.

"We urge you to fund the National Sea Grant College Program at no less than current levels. Sea Grant is vital to local businesses and an important part of preserving coastal communities for generations to come," the senators wrote. "Sea Grant's work supporting waterfront and maritime businesses speaks for itself. The federal investment in Sea Grant centers yields \$611 million in economic benefit, an 825% return on federal investment. We encourage you to provide robust support for the program in your final Fiscal Year 2019 budget."

Sheldon Whitehouse (D-R.I.), Richard Blumenthal (D-Conn.), Chris Coons (D-Del.), Debbie Stabenow (D-Mich.), Elizabeth Warren (D-Mass.), Amy Klobuchar (D-Minn.), Tammy Baldwin (D-Wis.), Jack Reed (D-R.I.), Maggie Hassan (D-N.H.), Tina Smith (D-Minn.), Ben Cardin (D-Md.), Mazie Hirono (D-Hawaii), Ron Wyden (D-Ore.), Kamala Harris (D-Calif.), Jeff Merkley (D-Ore.), Chris Van Hollen (D-Md.), Gary Peters (D-Mich.), Cory Booker (D-N.J.), Maria Cantwell (D-Wash.), Jeanne Shaheen (D-N.H.), and Bernie Sanders (I-Vt.) signed the letter.

METRICS & MEASURES

Number of acres of coastal habitat protected, enhanced, or restored as a result of Sea Grant activities

Definition: Coastal habitats include ocean, coastal, and Great Lakes habitats as defined in the Sea Grant legislation. Linear measures should either be converted to acres for this measure or reported as impacts or accomplishments. Indirect protection, enhancement, or restoration (e.g., through policy changes, fish stock enhancement, or habitat located downstream) should be highlighted in impacts or accomplishments, but not included in this measure.

In the notes section, please describe what actions were undertaken where and when, with what results, and provide links to any reports or publications related to this work.

Number of resource managers who use ecosystem-based approaches in the management of land, water, and living resources as a result of Sea Grant activities

Definition: Ecosystem-based approaches are integrated approaches to resource management that considers the entire ecosystem, including humans. They require managing ecosystems as a whole instead of separately managing their individual components or uses.

In the notes section, list the resource managers and/or agencies, and summarize Sea Grant's involvement. Use custom based approaches

Metrics, Performance Measures & Impacts

- Metrics vs. Performance measures
 - Metrics - Help us explain the scope of our work
 - Performance Measures - Help us track our progress towards our strategic plan
- Impacts vs. Accomplishments
 - 4 R's: Relevance, Response, Results, Recap

Reporting Tips

- **Use lay language:** We're not experts in all of your research fields
- **Be specific:** Please err on the side of **too much detail** rather than too little. It is easier for us to cut than to add.
- For impacts and accomplishments, include: **Who, what, when, where, why**
- **Start early.** It might be that you need information from partners or colleagues, or you might have questions for us
- **Fill out everything.** (even if it's just to say n/a - if you leave it blank we don't know that you read the section)
